

Phillip I. Perry II

It is not documented when Phillip I. Perry came to Colonial America but is recorded that his children were born here.

Phillip I. Perry II, (Peter Boyer Perry's 5th Great Grandfather) born in 1599, married Grace MacLand, born 1603.

Micajah Richard Perry, born 1641, son of Phillip I Perry II, sailed back to London. According to RootsWeb's World Connect, Micajah became a wealthy London merchant and shipowner. He was the founder of the Perry-Lane Company, which was established in London. His business partner was Thomas Lane. This is the company which financed the construction of William & Mary University in Virginia. Micajah had extensive trading links with Virginia. He was an active member of the Virginia Company. He financed not only tobacco trade with Virginia, but there is some evidence that he engaged in the transportation of

servants and slaves as well. A map of Virginia dating from the early 1600s is dedicated to him. ⁽¹²⁾

John Perry Sr.

John Perry Sr. (Peter Boyer Perry's 4th Great Grandfather), born in 1650, married Elizabeth MacLand, born 1661, before 1684 in the Virginia Colony.

In 1673 John Perry Sr., son of Phillip I. Perry, of "Isle of Wright", deceased sold the land he inherited from his father to Col. Joseph Bridges, owner of "Whitemarsh," who had a large estate nearby. In 1693 John Perry, son of Phillip I. Perry, transferred a tract of land to Col. Joseph Bridgers living in Whitemarsh.

On 10 Aug 1674, John Perry Sr. requested administration on the estate of John Young, who died intestate, he having married Elizabeth Young, daughter, and heir of John Young. His surities were John Marshall and Francis Ayers. ⁽¹²⁾

John Young was probably the son of Richard Young, who patented land in Isle of Wight in 1635. John Young was mentioned in the will of Edward Cherwine, 27 Sept 1649. ⁽¹²⁾

John Perry Sr. and his wife Elizabeth of the Upper Parish of Nansemond on May 26 1675, sold to Nathaniel Bacon 70 acres

in Lower Parish of Isle of Wight bought of John Young and Robert Butts. A John Perry Sr. held 870 acres in Nansemond in the Quit Rent of 1704. ⁽¹⁴⁾

John Perry, Jr.

John Perry, Jr. (Peter Boyer Perry's 3rd Great Grandfather) was born in 1680, in Nansemond, Virginia, Colony. John married Sarah Walton, and they had five sons and five daughters between 1729 and 1745. He died in 1760, at the age of 70 in Quoyokason Swamp, Bertie, Colonial North Carolina.

Richard Perry

Richard Perry (Peter Boyer Perry's Great Grandfather) born 1755, in Lancaster County, SC. He is listed in the Roster of South Carolina Patriots in the American Revolution, which show he enlisted in the Fourth Regiment on December 1, 1776, and in the Third Regiment on November 4, 1778. His war record was found for the enlistment in 1778.

It appears that Richard didn't marry until after his military service when he married Mary Stevens.

Per Lancaster County, SC Deed Book L, page 374:5 July 1827, Richard Perry of Lancaster County, SC deeded to Edward Lewis of Chester District, SC for \$75, one undivided half of tract of land or plantation lying on island of the Cataba (Catawba) River known by the name of Mountain Island, bounded on the E by part of sd River, N by land granted to George Platt, W by sd River being the South end of sd Island. Witnessed by John Murdock, John Perry. (17)

Joshua Sikes Perry

Joshua Sikes Perry, father of Peter Boyer Perry, was born in 1780 in Lancaster, South Carolina, he died on March 23, 1844, in Alachua, Florida, at the age of 64.

Joshua is listed in the military records as enlisting in the 2nd Reg't (McWillies) South Carolina Mil., for the War of 1812.

Joshua married Lucy Elmira Shurbert in 1812, and after his death in 1844, Lucy applied for and received a Widow's Pension for his service in 1812.



PETER BOYER PERRY

Mexican-American War 1846

Peter Boyer Perry was born on April 11, 1823, in Lancaster County, South Carolina.

At the age of 23, Peter enlisted in the U.S. Army in Charleston, South Carolina, on December 23, 1846, to serve in the *Mexican-American War*. He served as a Private in Company 1, Palmetto Regiment of South Carolina Volunteers Infantry, (SC Archives, "Index to Soldiers, Mexican War"). Peter is later described as 5' 10" with a dark complexion, dark hair, and gray eyes.

Peter's War Record from the National Archives

Peter's brother, Charles S. Perry, also enlisted as and was a Private, Company I, Palmetto Regiment, 1846. (SC Archives, "Index to Soldiers, Mexican War") By the time Charles regiment reached Vera Cruz, he had come down with the measles. His commanding officer ordered him to bed and instructed him to remain in Veracruz. However, the next day, Charles S Perry was feeling so much better that he went as far as Orazaba, Mexico, trying to catch up with his regiment. He became very ill and died at Orazaba, Mexico, in 1846.

Peter served under the command of Colonel P. M. Butler and
