Upon graduation from Hillsborough High School on June 7, 1957, I will receive a College Preparatory Diploma. My present average is 97.526%. My credits include one year each of Civics, United States History, and World History. I was greatly interested in these subjects. I explore the field of Science with enthusiasm. Because of this, I have thoroughly enjoyed my study of Biology and Chemistry. I have participated in musical activities for my school and my community. I plan to enter Florida State University for the fall semester of 1957, majoring in Nursing.

In my freshman year I was selected a charter member of the Hillsborough County Family Relations Youth Council which dealt with delinquency problems of our district. The faculty selected me to receive the I Dare You Award in recognition of qualities of leadership. Being soloist for Graduation and being elected "Brightest Girl" of the three hundred thirty graduates completed a perfect year.

In July, 1954, I graduated from the John W. Schaum Piano Course. That fall I entered Hillsborough High School which had an enrollment of two thousand six hundred. In becoming acquainted with the school and serving on the Student Council I made many friends, not only students but also faculty members. I was elected to membership in Kiwanettes, a girls' service organization limiting its membership to thirty-five. Next came membership in National Honor Society and Masque and Gavel. I was a laboratory assistant

for the biology department. I am now a member of the Future Nurses of America.

In addition to school activities I have participated in the work of the Methodist youth Fellowship and choirs of three churches. I am an active member of the Order of the Rainbow for Girls. I served my assembly as Worthy Advisor and secretary. In 1956, I was appointed Grand Musician of the State of Florida.

I have applied for admission to Florida State University for the fall semester, planning to major in nursing. The instruction received there will prepare me to be a nursing instructor or to do supervisory nursing. Although I have made application to the university, I do not know how the education will be financed; but I have faith and determination that I will be able to attend.

I greatly appreciate the privilege given to my daughter, Mary Joan Moore, to apply for the Elks National Foundation "Most Valuable Student" Scholarship. Because of my present financial situation, I will be unable to finance her college education. However, I am anxious for her to have the opportunity of furthering her education.

Emmitte A. Moore, my deceased husband, was employed as a pipe fitter in the Tampa Shipyard at the time of his death, which occurred December 25, 1944. Since that time Joan and I have received support through Social Security, which has paid forty dollars a month for each of us. In order to meet living expenses I have done laundry for my neighbors. On November 30, 1957, Joan will reach the age of eighteen. At that time the Social Security checks both for her and me will be discontinued. Since I am sixty years of age I do not feel that I will be able to find employment at that time and see no chance of my being able to finance Joan's education.


TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:


It is a real pleasure to recommend Mary Joan Moore for the Elks Scholarship.


This is to certify that I have known Joan Moore for a number of years, having worked with her in our Sunday School Department and also have been associated in Rainbow Girl's work.
